

 "Whenever I read God's Word I always try to remember that the Bible is God's Love Letter to me and that the Lord has a personal message just for me."
"When the Lord teaches me something from His Word I enjoy sharing that truth with my family and friends. I'm also very thankful whenever I have an opportunity to talk to an unsaved person about the Lord and what Christ has done for me."
