## John 10:27-30

What an amazing promise

the Good Shepherd gives to those who are His true sheep: "And I give unto them eternal life; and **they shall never perish**, neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand." Eternal life is a gift, and it is the present possession of all who have received Christ by faith (*John* 6:47). It involves a personal relationship with the living God which will never end (*John 17:3*). "God hath given to us eternal life, and this life is in His Son. He that hath the Son hath life" (*1 John 5:11-12*).

Not only do Christ's sheep have eternal life (an invaluable gift which God will never revoke), but they "shall never perish." This phrase is amazingly strong in the Greek language. First, the double negative is used, and it could be rendered, "they shall **never ever** perish." But it is even stronger than that. There is a word in the Greek text which is not translated in our English version, the word "forever." **Forever they will never perish!** Or to render it another way, "They shall never ever perish, no not ever!" More secure we cannot be!

On top of this our Lord assures His sheep that they are doubly secure in the hands of the Shepherd and in the hands of the Father (*John 10:28-30*). *Safe am I, safe am I, in the hollow of His hand!* It would take someone greater than God to be able to pluck us from His hands. Impossible! But this wonderful promise of eternal security applies only to those who are His true sheep. His sheep hear His voice and follow Him (*John 10:27*).
