True Biblical Love is Shown af Calvary 1 John 4:7-19

The world knows little of *Calvary Love*. It is a love that springs from the heart of God and was demonstrated on Golgotha's cross. *Amazing love, how can it be, that Thou my God shouldst die for me! ...How can it be? That God should love a soul like me, O how can it be?* It was there that the spotless Lamb of God gave Himself sacrificially for the ungodly, for His enemies, for vile sinners (Rom. 5:6,8,10). John 3:16 points to *Calvary Love* and 1 John 3:16 challenges every believer to do the same: "Hereby perceive we the love of God, because He laid down His life for us: and we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren."

True Biblical love involves four ingredients:

♥ **DECIDING** – I must decide that I am going to love the other person (regardless of how I feel about him/her), simply because that person has a genuine need and I am able to meet that need. True love begins as an act of the will.

 $\forall GIVING - I$ must give of myself for the sake of the other person. I am concerned, not about what I can get from this person, but what I can give to this person.

♥*SACRIFICING* – Giving always involves a sacrifice and a cost. My love for another person may cost me money; it may cost me time; it may cost me sleep. It may involve discomfort or pain. I am willing to spend and be spent for the benefit and welfare of the person loved (2 Cor. 12:15). The cost is certainly worth it, because it is more blessed to give than to receive (Acts 20:35).

♥*SEEKING* – I must seek the highest and the best for the person loved. I want nothing less than God's best for this person! Such love is possible only by the Spirit of God (Gal. 5:22).
