## Priorities:

# Choose You This Day! Romans 6:11-22

A priority is something that we deem to have a high level of importance. Instead of doing other things, we give the matter precedence. We need to learn to get our priorities right, that is, to decide which are the most important duties or problems and deal with them first. When people say they do not have enough time to get things done, this actually is not a time problem but a priority problem. A person always makes time to do what he considers to be most important.

As believers we need to make sure that our priorities match God's priorities. What does God consider to be most important? Consider the following choices:

- **1** I CHOOSE the heavenly over the earthly: "Seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth on the right hand of God. Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth" (Col. 3:1-2).
- **2** I CHOOSE the eternal over the temporal: "While we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen: for the things which are seen are temporal, but the things which are not seen are eternal" (2 Cor. 4:18).
- **3** I CHOOSE eternal pleasures (*Psalm 16:11*) over short-lived sinful pleasures: "Choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God, than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season" (Heb. 11:25).
- **4** I CHOOSE the things of Christ over selfish interests: "For all seek their own, not the things which are Jesus Christ's" (*Phil. 2:21*).
- **5** I CHOOSE to please God and others rather than to please self (*Rom.* 15:1-3).
- **6** ICHOOSE true riches over earthly riches (*Matt. 6:19-20; Luke 16:11*).
- **7** I CHOOSE to love God over loving pleasures (2 Tim. 3:4).
- **8** I CHOOSE to serve God rather than sin and self (*Rom. 6:16*).
