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CHAPTER 4

The Glorious Truth Of Justification

| To understand what the Bible teaches on the subject of JUSTIFICATION, it is helpful to picture in our minds a courtroom scene with GOD Himself as the "J of all the E " (Genesis 18:25). With this in mind, we shall now consider the five great facts which help us to understand the true meaning of JUSTIFICATION: |
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| FACT NUMBER 1All men are guilty and condemned before God. |
| Consider carefully Romans 3:9-19 where we see ourselves just as God sees us (the God who is perfectly holy and absolutely righteous). According to verse 10, are you RIGHTEOUS or UNRIGHTEOUS? |
| Read Romans 3:19. As we stand before God the Righteous Judge, is the verdict "GUILTY" or "NOT GUILTY"? How many men and women share this same verdict (Romans 3:23)? |
| THE VERDICT (DECISION): "YOU'RE 6 (Rom. 3:19) SON RIGHTEUS HOLY SPIRIT |
| FACT NUMBER 2The penalty for sin is death. |
| Not only are we guilty, but there is a penalty involved. In Romans 1:29-31 we find a terrible list of sins. As you honestly consider this list, have you done any of these things? We learn in Romans 1:32 that those who commit such <i>things</i> (the things mentioned in verses 29-31) are worthy of! 

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What is this death penalty? We must remember that this death (Romans 6:23) is more than just physical death. This "so great death" involves SPIRITUAL DEATH and SPIRITUAL DEATH consists mainly of two things: 1) SEPARATION FROM GOD; 2) PUNISHMENT BY GOD. The following verses speak of spiritual death (hell, which is also called "the second death"). FACT NUMBER 3--The penalty must be paid.

God the righteous Judge cannot say, "You deserve the death penalty, but because I'm a merciful God I'll forget about that and I'll let you live!" If God were to do that, it's true He would be merciful, but He would no longer be Just, He would no longer be holy and He would no longer be righteous! Can God stop being what HE IS? (see Malachi 3:6)



Consider these verses: 1 Corinthians 15:3; Romans 5:6,8 and 1 Peter 3:18. Who paid the



Although we are not righteous in ourselves, when a person believes on the Lord Jesus Christ, God sees him as righteous IN CHRIST. We are righteous because we are IN God's righteous Son! "But of Him are ye ____ Christ Jesus, who of God is made unto us wisdom, and ___ " (1 Cor. 1:30). Because God sees us in his Son we are righteous: "For He (God the Father) hath made Him (Jesus) to be sin for us, who knew no sin, that we might be made the ____ of God IN HIM" (2 Cor. 5:21). We are no longer guilty, condemned sinners because we are now IN CHRIST:



Because God in His grace has *justified me* (declared me to be righteous in His righteous Son--"just as if I had never sinned"), what kind of life should I now live? Read Titus 2:11-14 and circle the correct answer:

TEN ASPECTS OF JUSTIFICATION

- 1. The *Need* of Justification: All men lack and need the righteousness of God (Rom. 3:10; Isa. 64:6).
- 2. The *Meaning* of Justification: the term means "to declare or to pronounce righteous" (*not* "to make righteous"). It is a judicial term (Deut. 25:1) and its opposite is "condemnation" (Rom. 5:16-19).
- 3. The *Problem* of Justification: How can God be just and at the same time justify the believing sinner? (Rom. 3:26; Rom. 4:5). This is a problem that only the grace of god could solve.
- 4. The *Basis* of Justification: "justified *by His blood*" (Rom. 5:9). The cross-work of Christ is the one and only basis for justification (2 Cor. 5:21).
- 5. The Source of Justification: "justified freely by His grace" (Rom. 3:24). It's all of God and all of grace!
- 6. The *Channel* of Justification: "justified *by faith*" (Rom. 3:28; 5:1). The free gift of God's righteousness must be received and personally appropriated (Rom. 5:17).
- 7. The *Example* of Justification: "Abraham believed God and it was counted unto him for righteousness" (Gen. 15:6; Rom. 4).
- 8. The *Result* of Justification: God's perfect righteousness is put to the account of the believing sinner. As a result he is free from condemnation and has peace with God (Rom. 4:3-5; 2 Cor. 5:21; 1 John 3:7; Rom. 5:1; 8:1).
- 9. The *Evidence* of Justification: "justified *by works*" (James 2:14-22). This is how Christians "show their faith" and prove to men the reality of their justification.
- 10. The *Hope* (future expectation) of Justification: "whom He justified, them He also *glorified*" (Rom. 8:30). It is guaranteed and in the mind of God it is already done!
